

WORDS ON THE PEDESTAL OF THE STATURE OF LIBERTY

Emma Lazarus was born in 1849 and died in 1887. She was little known and was unheralded in her day. Yet, some words she wrote live on.

To help raise funds for the pedestal upon which the Stature of Liberty would stand, she wrote "*The New Colossus*." Her poem is now nearly as famous as the work of art which it celebrates.

The closing lines of her poem are, "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breath free, the wretched refuse of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me, I lift my lamp beside the golden door."

Lazarus' words are very much in the news at this time due to the controversy over children being separated from their migrant parents at our southern border. While I certainly have feelings about that, it is not the purpose of this short article to discuss that matter.

The Christians' Stature of Liberty is the cross of Jesus Christ. It still stands today inviting the tired, the poor, the huddled masses yearning to breathe free to come to the Savior. He alone can make men and women truly free. He alone can break the chains that bind us.

It is our responsibility as Christians to let people know of His invitation and to encourage them to accept it. That is the purpose of this month's series of sermons on Sunday mornings, "Breaking the Chains."


