MORE INFORMATION FROM BARNA

There is more news from the Barna Group about Christianity in the United States, and it is not good. According to a nation-wide sampling of 76,505 adults conducted over a period of seven years, the influences of Christianity are waning.

The report says that church attendance, religious affiliation, belief in God, prayers and Bible-reading have been dropping for decades. It also says that the church no longer functions with the cultural authority it did in times past and that we are in a "Post-Christian" era.

Surprising to me was the part of the report that said 5 of the top 10 most post-Christian cities are in the Northeast or New England. New York was number 7, San Francisco was number 8, Los Angeles was number 18, and Chicago was number 19. If you are wondering, Knoxville was number 75 and Nashville was number 89.

What is your response to these statistics? Many will be like chicken little and says the "sky is falling." I am not denying that these figures are discouraging, but I do recommend a more positive response.

What if we were to say, "God has set a great challenge before us, so let's get busy and do everything we can to stem this tide in our little corner of the world.

The Great Commission is still applicable, so let's "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15).
